
THE CRAFTY ARTIST

Coloured pencil has been one of my favourite mediums for many years. It is portable, easy to clean up and easy for precision and control. Today, artists quality coloured pencils are lightfast and are designed for longevity.

This year the winner of the Dobell prize for drawing was Rosemary Lee, with her coloured pencil drawing "24-1". Hopefully this will raise the profile of this wonderful and overlooked medium.

This award winning drawing depicts Sydney's urban landscape in a constant state of flux-construction sites rise, old buildings fall, and the city reshapes itself each year.

The drawing focusses on the suburbs of Ashfield and Summer Hill, an area undergoing rapid change, the judges praised her ability to weave together the two landscapes ,the construction site and the demolition site. Every time I look at the image, I see something new.

This drawing was selected from 965 entries and 56 finalists. There are some stunning drawings in this year's prize and really worth visiting if you get the opportunity. You can also look online also to see this masterful collection of works.




Sanctuary Village: Sip and See 2025
