#### Tweed Gallery visit

I recently went to visit the <u>Tweed Gallery</u> lured by the chance to see one of Monet's "*Haystacks*" which is on loan from the National Gallery, of course the Monet was beautiful.

There are also several other exhibitions on show, including the <u>Byron Art School</u> (which seemed to favour the teachers rather than the students), and exhibition of still life works using Margaret Oley's objects (some very impressive work here).

The ones I liked the best were the big splashes of colour by Laura Jones.





There never seems to be a break for the Art Prizes and I've listed a couple that are coming up.

#### 1. Adelaide Perry Prize for Drawing 2024

Inaugurated in 2006, the Prize is named in honour of respected painter, printmaker and draughtswoman, <u>Miss Adelaide Elizabeth Perry</u> (1891-1973) who taught Visual Arts at PLC Sydney from 1930 to 1962, the Prize attracts submissions from around the country.

The <u>Perry Prize</u> is one of the most well regarded of its kind in Australia. PLC Sydney and the <u>Adelaide</u> <u>Perry Gallery</u> gratefully acknowledge our judges, for their vast knowledge and expertise, and all of the entrants for their participation and support of the Prize.

- Prize a \$25,000 acquisitive award for Drawing
- Exhibition 40 finalists' works will be held from 24 February to 22 March 2024 at:

Adelaide Perry Gallery (located in the old Croydon Hotel) 'The Croydon' Centre for Art, Design & Technology Cnr Hennessy and College Streets Croydon NSW 2132

<u>Entries</u> close – midnight (AEDT), Wednesday, 10 January 2024

#### 2. The Percivals 2024

<u>The Percivals</u> (with a prize money of \$53,000) is an open competition for artists to submit work in the following categories, the:

- Percival Portrait Painting Prize major acquisitive prize of \$40,000
- People's Choice award prize \$1,000
- Percival Photographic Portrait major acquisitive prize of \$10,000
- People's Choice award \$1,000; and
- Percival Animal Portrait includes a nonacquisitive prize of \$1,000.

While showcasing the outstanding and innovative work currently being produced by Australian artists, the competitions also allow many emerging artists to engage with portraiture and share their expressions of themselves and those close to them.

Applications close 10am (AEST), Tuesday, 13 February 2024

#### 3. <u>Waterhouse Natural Science Art Prize</u> 2024

The <u>Waterhouse Natural Science Art Prize</u> was launched in 2002 and is named in honour of the South Australian Museum's first curator, Frederick George Waterhouse.

Artists of any age, nationality, and experience who create art relating to the natural world are invited to enter the Waterhouse Natural Science Art Prize 2024.

There are 2 main categories of prizes, they are:

- **Open Prize** \$30,000
- Emerging Artists Prize \$10,000; also
- The People's Choice Prize.

<u>Entries</u> are now open and close at 5.00pm on Monday, 4 December 2023

An exhibition of finalists' works will be held from 6 April to 10 June 2024 at the:

## ARTISTS PROFILE

### Françoise Sauvère

Born in Sénégal, Françoise spent her childhood with her family in France and Indonesia before migrating to Australia.



After gaining her Diploma of Education she developed an interest in the visual arts whilst working as a teacher with children.

Searching for her family heritage, she returned to France during the 1990's, where she worked as a teacher and worked as a cook in an artistic educational centre for adults.

Then two years working as a teacher in visual arts in India inspired her to conjugate colours and tastes.

Returning to Europe she attended the <u>Assenza</u> <u>Maleschule Art School</u> in Basel for two years, where she immersed herself in the work of colour, etching, printing and drawing.

After a period as a French language teacher, Francoise now divides her time between Europe and Australia; two varied contrasted lands that are a continual source of inspiration.

The central starting point of her work is nature in the contemplation of her surrounding environment. She immerses herself in the visible. Her preferred mediums are acrylics, collage, and pencils.

Her work is not a direct representation of the world, although subtle representations of plants and landscapes, sometimes rocks and water scenes can be seen.

The world of colour, the play of light and the relationship of colours motivate her to look with more attention. She believes that art nourishes one's soul and allows one to perceive the world in another manner.

Francoise has been an enthusiastic member of BACCI for 3 years and this year has taken on the role of president.

"My work is always about the light" Maria says "and this year is no different. I find light so fascinating!"

Anyone who spend time with Maria soon realises that observing light and shadows is Maria's constant occupation. "You cannot paint until you learn to see and observe tone and colour. I have taught many forms of art for over 35 years, and I find sharing knowledge very rewarding."

A versatile artist with nearly 40 years' experience and experimentation under her belt, Maria explores the gift of light in her rich land and seascapes and still life paintings. Always inspired by her beautiful garden, Maria can be found painting vases of flowers backlit by the sun or early morning light filtering through the trees on a crisp autumn morning, the dappled light through rainforest trees beside the creek near her home or epic landscapes painted after her travels.

What began as a hobby in the early 1980's has become a lifestyle. Once a regular at local markets and then for 2 years Maria ran her own gallery, and at one stage "*I was holding 6 classes a week and painting and running the gallery ... I got a little burnt out*" she says.

Maria's most recent achievements are:

- 2023 Bentley Art Prize second prize (highly commended) for a painting called "*First Light in Tenterfield*", and
- Tursa Prize Lismore Highly commended for a sunrise over the beach painting called "In the Moment"
